Court Booking System

Remember to keep your contact details up to date by maintaining your profile on the Member Information page on the court

booking system. Here are some other tips about using the system:

- Find your opponent to send them a notification that the court is booked and give them the opportunity to pay their share of the court.
- Booking a court for a league match? Click on the League Match button to send a notification email to each member of your league. They will then be given the option to sign on to your booking the next time they access the court booking website.
- Take care when replying to email messages from the court booking system. They may not be addressed to who you think they are and you can't guarantee that anyone will receive them.

Online Purchase of Credit

You can now purchase booking credit over the web through the club website by means of PayPal. You need to register on the club website in order to use this function but you don't need your own personal PayPal account. The credit does not get applied to you account immediately but we are usually able to credit your account within a day or two.

Open Day

The Club will be holding an open day on Saturday 9th October. The event will be aimed at prospective new members and current members alike.

Members of the first team will be on hand to give demonstration matches and will be making themselves available for challenges so bring your kit along!

There will also be a professional coach on hand to offer tips and advice.

AGM

We held an AGM in June and here for the benefit of anyone who was unable to squeeze into the meeting room are some of the major talking points:

- The Club heating system is to be re-vamped to avoid a repeat of the conditions experienced last winter. This will include keeping the courts above a reasonable minimum temperature.
- The electrics are to be inspected and overhauled.
- It was reported that some members might be indulging in physical activities other than squash or racketball, possibly on the courts. I hope they are using the appropriate protective gear. It was not clear whether shoes were involved (non-marking or otherwise) or whether this was a lights on or lights off activity.

Squash Leagues

The Winter leagues are set to resume at the beginning of October. If you are intending to re-join the leagues in time for the October league then add your name to the list on the noticeboard, email leagues@gxsquash.org.uk or use the [form](#) on the club website.

Use the online league system to record your league scores online. This allows members to register for entry into the leagues, enter their scores for league matches and maintain their status in the league. The main purpose for this change is to prevent the problems caused by illegible or incorrect scores on the sheets and the fallibility of emails when trying to communicate with the league secretary. Future leagues may see a points bonus for scores recorded over the web.

The contest for the leading points scorer throughout the 2009/10 Winter leagues was won by Robert Rickman with Malcolm Mackay coming second.

Squash Ladder

The squash ladder remains popular with a small number of members. There are currently 30 members signed up to the ladder with 75% of matches being played by just 3 of them.

New members are able to challenge anyone on the ladder for their first challenge. After that, members are restricted to challenging up to 4 places above their current position.
